

# Credit Suisse Commodity Return Strategy Fund

### Investment Objective

The fund seeks total return.

The fund is designed to achieve positive total return relative to the performance of the Bloomberg Commodity Index Total Return (BCOM Index)\*\*.

### Investment Approach

Invests in commodity-linked derivative instruments, backed by a portfolio of short-maturity investment-grade fixed income securities normally having an average duration of one year or less. Invests in futures contracts on individual commodities or a subset of commodities, structured notes and/or swaps and options on them through investments in a wholly-owned subsidiary of the fund formed in the Cayman Islands. Cash collateral is managed conservatively, using a risk-controlled process that seeks to maintain the diversification qualities of the benchmark.

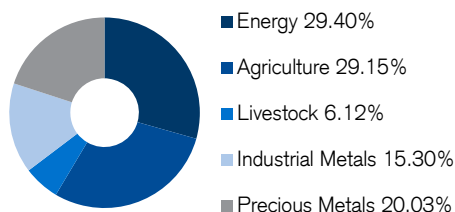
### Quarterly Performance Summary:

- Class I of the Fund increased 2.50% at NAV during the first quarter compared to the Bloomberg Commodity Index which gained 2.19%.
- Commodity exposure was generally positioned further out along the curve during the quarter.
- Curve positioning in the Energy, Livestock, and Industrial Metals sectors contributed to benchmark-relative performance, while positioning within the Agriculture sector detracted from returns, gross of fees. Positioning in the Precious Metals sector neither contributed to nor detracted from returns.
- Fixed income collateral management detracted from relative performance.

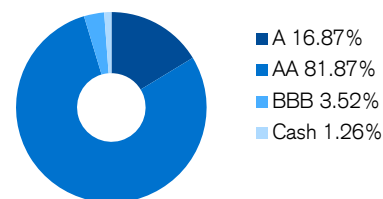

The Trust is authorized to reimburse Credit Suisse for management fees previously limited and/or for expenses previously paid by Credit Suisse, provided, however, that any reimbursements must be paid at a date not more than three years after the end of the fiscal year during which such fees were limited or expenses were paid by Credit Suisse and the reimbursements do not cause a class to exceed the applicable expense limitation in the contract at the time the fees were limited or expenses were paid.
